CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

5.1 Conclusion

Personality analysis of a character in a movie can be done using various theories. In research regarding the analysis of Hazel Grace Lancaster as the main character in the *The Fault in Our Stars* movie, the researcher uses two theories. The main theory that is the reference for this research is the psychological aspect originating from Sigmund Freud's psychoanalysis. Then, the results of this analysis are supported by the feminist theory of Simone de Beauvoir's Existentialist Feminism. The researcher has found continuity between the two theories, which can be used to answer research questions. All data from this research were taken from *The Fault in Our Stars* movie.

The answer to the first research question is about the role of existentialist feminist theory in the psychological condition of Hazel Grace Lancaster. The researcher found psychological actions that were the influence of existentialist feminism, including not easily trusting other people, raising opinions about the image of freedom at her age, creating firmness in opinion, and brings up thoughts of alertness. This finding shows that the role of existentialist feminism was very influential as a form of self-defense for Hazel Grace, a girl who suffered from cancer from childhood to adolescence.

The answer to the second research question is about Hazel Grace Lancaster's personality based on psychological aspects and feminist theory. This psychological aspect, which is the theory of psychoanalyst Sigmund Freud, includes three aspects that form personality, namely the id, ego and superego. Id and ego show Hazel's bad personality. Hazel has an id whose wishes must always be granted without thinking about the risks, an ego that is stubborn and opposes the truth that other people say. But, this is for a good purpose. Then, she has a superego as a barrier between the id and ego. This superego can be seen when she tries to accept the fact that due to her illness, she cannot go to Amsterdam to meet the author of her favorite book. Furthermore, the researcher has found that Hazel has a good personality, seen based on psychological aspect and existentialist feminist theory. Characters that show this personality include a good girl who wants to be independent, smart, a good woman who respects other people, polite but brave, doesn't give up easily, and a spry girlfriend.

Based on the analysis above, the researcher concluded that overall, Hazel Grace Lancaster has a good personality and is a tough woman. Her condition, which was seriously ill, did not make her physically or mentally weak, in fact she showed more strength. Everything she does is a form of Hazel's existence to make her wishes come true, fight for her life, and live happily with the people she loves.

5.2 Suggestion

In this research, the researcher used Sigmund Freud's Psychoanalysis theory and Simone de Beauvoir's Existentialist Feminism theory, which apparently can be connected to analyzing the personality of the main character in *The Fault in Our Stars* movie.
